The Galisteo Basin Preserve is a land conservation and community development initiative located 14 miles south of Santa Fe, New Mexico. Embracing nearly 10,000 acres of sculpted arroyos, craggy sandstone formations and vast savanna grasslands, the preserve is a place of refuge and sustenance for wildlife and people.

With nearly 43 miles of publicly-accessible trails open to hikers, mountain bikers and equestrians, the Galisteo Basin Preserve is loved and actively enjoyed by thousands of residents and visitors. It is a place of community and quiet reflection: a place of renewal and inspiration.
